Huck Finn Goes Feudal: Or Feudal Finn

TOPIC: To help students make connections between eras and times and develop characterization skills.

WHY: Social hierarchies continue to be relevant in today's society. It is important to consider the elements that influence hierarchies in order to identify the beliefs and values of a society. Huck Finn lived in a very hierarchal society as well. Let's see if we can take our knowledge of feudal society and apply this to the characters in Huck Finn!

What:

- Create 3 infographics with 3 separate characters from Huck Finn and 3 different roles in Feudal society
- Label the infographics with the name of the characters and his or her role in Feudal society
- Create labels which provide evidence to support your claim for the Feudal roles of the characters from Huck Finn

Evaluate:

- Your audience should be able to answer the following questions from your infographic:
 - o What are the different characteristics of specific roles within Feudal society?
 - What evidence is presented to justify how the Huck Finn character fits into the Feudal role?
 - o What internal and external characteristics are revealed in the infographic?

- Notice how the soldier's clothing items show how they functioned on the battle field.
 - But, don't forget about physical characteristics and personality traits
- Label your character's external and internal traits to show how they would function in Feudal roles.
